21c One Country’s h/c crisis	<p><i>“i’m 9 months pregnant,....I’ll give birth anytime now” (5’)</i></p> <p><u>NARRATION</u></p>
Opsi dahgo being checked	<p>With more and more rural nurses to check up on her, the birth of her baby is no longer life-threatening.</p>
MDG b-roll	<p>If we act and provide all women with access to healthcare, most maternal deaths could be prevented. (14’)</p>
UNIA 1082 China population report	<p>In China, industrialisation has lifted millions out of poverty. After working for others, Luo Changkun and her husband saved enough money to start their own small company. (12.5’)</p>

UN Ext. Kids laughing</p>	<p>BUT more than half way to the target date of 2015 we are not on track. The gaps are wide the obstacles steep. (11')</p> <p>Half a million women continue to die each year from complications of pregnancy and childbirth.</p> <p>75 million children still do not attend primary school. (13')</p> <p><u>Sound bite</u></p> <p><i>"I dropped out because I did not have a school uniform. My mother wanted me to work so that one day, hopefully, I can have a uniform again". (10')</i></p> <p><u>NARRATION</u></p> <p>If current trends continue two and a half billion people will be without basic sanitation in 2015...1.4 billion will live in extreme poverty. Rising food and energy prices <i>and</i> the global credit crisis may make things even worse. (22')</p> <p>Citizens are demanding action. Last year 43 million stood up against poverty, part of a growing global movement. (9') <small>*The 2008 figure (more than 110 million people) is used in the Japanese subtitle.</small></p> <p>World leaders made the promise. Now its time for us to deliver. Together we can make it happen. (9')</p>
